#### QUEEN'S PARK HIGH SCHOOL STRIKES GOLD!

Queen's Park High School became a nationally recognised outstanding provider of arts education this month having been awarded 'Artsmark Gold' by an individual assessor on behalf of Trinity College in London.



Through a rigorous application and inspection process the school was identified as having an outstanding commitment to the arts and the independent assessor commented in his report that: 'Through conversations during the school visit stage with the school headteacher, pupils and Artsmark lead around the arts, it is evident that the arts are impacting on pupils selfconfidence, self-esteem and attitude to learning, including pupils with additional behavioural needs'. He then went on to say that 'The students also have an almost tangible love for the arts and enthusiasm for learning and self-expression through the arts. They also display a confidence and pride in their achievements. The Head, governors and staff team demonstrate an exemplary commitment to developing the arts in all forms as a powerful, dynamic approach to teaching and learning across all areas of the curriculum, and a deep rooted understanding of how the arts can be a highly effective tool for developing the whole child and those with additional needs'.



Matt Yeoman, Director of Learning for the Visual and Performing Arts said, 'This is a fantastic accolade for the school and a true reflection of the outstanding work that the Visual and Performing Arts teachers do, to support students in the development of a life-long passion for not only the arts, but for learning too. Queen's Park High is now a recognised shining example of how arts education can be delivered at its best and we are now looking to share our practice with other schools as we continue to enrich the arts experience of young people in Chester'.

The award comes after a series of highly successful arts experiences for the students including the introduction of a GCSE in Animation, a huge scale production of Les Misérables, performances of Shakespeare's Hamlet and A Midsummer Night's Dream at the Floral Pavilion, alongside trips to Paris, London and finally Broadway in New York this coming Easter. Representatives of the student council will be attending a celebration event later this year where they will be formally presented with their certificate and plaque for the school.

Lyndsay Watterson, Headteacher, is thrilled for the school's achievements to be recognised in this way. She said 'this award puts Queen's Park High School at the forefront of inspiring practice around the arts within our locality. Our aim now is to work collaboratively with other schools and institutions to share excellent practice around arts education so that we can collectively inspire more young people to become confident, independent and successful learners in the future. I am very proud of the achievements of all our students and would just like to congratulate them and our committed staff, they thoroughly deserve this award.'

#### **'V' FACTOR**

Friday the 27 March saw the eagerly anticipated evening of this years 'V Factor' with students from all years competing live on stage for a chance to win an all-expenses paid overnight stay in London including two West End shows.

The competition was fierce and quite rightly so as the high quality performances kept the audience of nearly 300 people thoroughly entertained. Sitting directly in front of the stage were the V Factor judges who had a really tough time marking the performances and feeding back to the performers on stage.

With over 40 talented students involved, making a decision was very difficult, with the top three places only separated by a few points. In third place with their performance of Lady GaGa and Beyonce's *Telephone* were Year 11 students, Bianca McMullen and Liam Thompson who were just pipped to second place by Year 9 student Alistair Hogan with his performance of Sam Smith's *Lay Me Down*.



However, the judges decided that the overall winner and grand prize had to go to the performer who kept the audience thrilled with every note sang. This year's V Factor winner was Louis McHugh from Year 10 with his performance of Drake's *Hold On, We're Going Home.* Louis stunned the audience with his amazing voice and we can all see a very bright future for him with his talent!

Of course the main reason for the evening was to raise money for our school charity, Claire House. The school council were moved when they heard about the work the hospice does and so too were the other students in school who helped to make the evening a sell-out success and raise £700 for the charity.

Once again, the students of Queen's Park High School have exceeded the expectations of us all and helped to not only provide an evening of high quality entertainment, but support other children who are not as fortunate. They are a credit to the school.

### ART, PHOTOGRAPHY & GEOGRAPHY TRIP TO LONDON

During February half term, students from Years 11, 12 and 13 spent their time visiting major galleries; the Tate Modern, The National Portrait Gallery and the Photographers Gallery to collect ideas for their current exam based research. **STEM CLUB** 



A new STEM Club started on the16 March to celebrate STEM



week. Aimed at KS4 & KS5 students, the Micro-controller Challenge will provide students with the opportunity to learn how to write code and program a micro-controller to carry out a variety of tasks. The club is led by STEM Ambassador Roger Todd and Mr Griffiths.

Key Stage 3 Science Club students have also been working with STEM ambassador Roger Todd and have entered the Big Bang Competition 2015.

Students have started their project which is to design and evolve a model boat that is able to move on its own. Students are in the middle of designing their boats using different materials and electronics and adding features that will allow them to move including making papier-mâché and testing this with materials from the Design and Technology department to select an appropriate material to build their boats. The boats and ideas will then be presented to judges at the Big Bang Competition in July.

Queen's Park High School gained several medals during the English Indoor Rowing Championships at the Manchester Velodrome; rowers of all ages competed against each other on indoor rowing machines.

Emily Cox from Year 11 achieved a silver medal and a personal best time after rowing 2000m.



Year 9 boys, Charlie Birchall-Jones, Cameron Neill, Aiden Farrelly and Henry Dougherty achieved a silver medal rowing over 3000m.

Another team of Year 9 boys, Connor Mewburn-Mercer, Morgan Whitley, Max Harvey and Harrison Kendall-Smith came away with a bronze medal.

The Rowing Club entered 25 athletes across all year groups, including a team of four Year 6 pupils from Belgrave Primary School who will all be Queen's Park High School students in September and future rowers.

James Cox also competed in the Year 6 single event rowing for two minutes achieving a silver medal.
